## The New Gamma-Alpha Educational Foundation Established



This past April, our own new Gamma-Alpha Educational Foundation awarded scholarships to five outstanding Gamma-Alpha brothers, one for \$2,000 and four for \$1,000. The Gamma-Alpha of Kappa Sigma Educational Foundation is now officially established, following confirmation from the IRS granting 501(c)(3) status in April 2016. Our Educational Foundation is Gamma-Alpha's alone, and is domiciled separately from our National scholarship program. We understand that our new Foundation is one-of-a-kind within Kappa Sigma.

Our Gamma-Alpha Foundation is endowed with fund proceeds that have been carefully invested and managed since the sale of our property more than 10 years ago. The endowment is intended to continue into the future, and is anticipated to grow through tax-deductible alumni contributions.

Undergraduate members may apply for and possibly receive scholarship support from both the Gamma-Alpha and National programs: the application forms for Gamma-Alpha Educational Foundation and National scholarships are nearly identical.

Foundation scholarships will be awarded based on merit and involvement in academics, campus life, and the fraternity, under the following terms:

• Up to \$10,000 will be awarded each March for spring term, with the application date and process matching the National fraternity's procedure.

# Past Worthy Grand Master Henry L. Bauer Joins the Chapter Celestial

Past Worthy Grand Master Henry L. Bauer joined the Chapter Celestial of Kappa Sigma Fraternity on Tuesday evening, March 22, 2016. Brother Bauer was an April 19, 1947, initiate of the Gamma-Sigma Chapter at Oregon State University, was a member of the Gamma-Sigma House Corporation, and served as Gamma-Sigma Chapter's Alumnus Advisor. Brother Bauer also served as District Grand Master for the Oregon District.



Brother Bauer served on the Supreme Executive Committee from 1973 until 1979 and served in the offices of Worthy Grand Master of Ceremonies (1973-1975), Worthy Grand Procurator (1975-1977), and Worthy Grand Master (1977-1979). Brother Bauer was Vice Chairman of the Kappa Sigma Endowment Fund and also served as Secretary for the Endowment Fund. He served the Endowment Fund as a Trustee from 1993 until 2003. Hank was one of two members of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity to serve as President of the National Interfraternity Conference.

Brother Bauer's son, Tom, is a May 30, 1981, initiate of the Theta-Epsilon Chapter at Portland State University.

Brother Bauer was an active leader at the local and national level for the Boy Scouts of America. He was a well-respected leader in the Portland community and had an established law practice throughout his career, Henry L. Bauer & Associates PC.

Brother Bauer was one of the most significant modern day leaders of Kappa Sigma Fraternity. The Kappa Sigma Fraternity extends its most sincere condolences to the members of the Bauer family. We keep them in our thoughts and prayers.

### **National Scholarships**

Nationally, The Kappa Sigma Endowment fund gives away hundreds of thousands of dollars to undergraduate brothers all across the country.

Through Kappa Sigma's national Scholarship-Leadership Awards, young members are honored for their outstanding journey in education. Since 1947, the Scholarship-Leadership Awards have remained the Endowment Fund's hallmark program, boasting nearly \$5 million in disbursements benefiting thousands of brothers demonstrating excellence in academics, campus involvement, and fraternity leadership.

Award recipients are named each Founders Day (December 10) and merit recognition for: academic performance; fulfilling fraternity and campus leadership roles; participating in varsity athletics and other collegiate programs; demonstrating Kappa Sigma ritual proficiency; and taking part in honor societies and other activities.

### Gamma-Alpha 2016 Boot Camp



Each year, Gamma-Alpha hosts a four-day campaign to raise money for the Fisher House foundation. This foundation, established in 1990, provides low-cost homes for the families of injured service men and women.

This year, Gamma Alpha raised a total of \$5,800 for Fisher House through four main events:

- A pig roast on the Oregon campus, with admission tickets sold to raise money.
- An online "gofundme" campaign that was advertised to family, friends, and local businesses.
- A multi-day tabling project outside of the Duckstore, with Kappa Sigma dog tags sold to raise money
- A half-day boot camp event, in which sorority teams pay to compete in various competitions.

Our philanthropy this year, led by junior Drew Stoll, was a huge success, and was a great opportunity for our chapter to bond together in fellowship while serving a good cause.

We congratulate the beautiful ladies of Kappa Delta for being this year's boot camp champions and winning a function with us!

In addition to philanthropy, all of our members participate in various community service events every term. We partner with local retirement homes, food banks, fundraisers, and animal shelters to organize events where we can give back to our community. We are proud to announce that for the 2016 school year, our chapter averaged 5.2 hours of community service per member, per term. This means that we are at a total of over 1400 hours of community service for this year alone!

**Don R. Belding, Jr., '41-510**, of Escondido, California, died May 30, 2015, at age 93.

John E. Meeke, Jr., '46-584, of Beaverton, Oregon,

passed away July 4, 2016. Jack was born in 1926 in Hardin, Montana, and moved with his family to Portland in 1930. He graduated from Beaverton High School in 1944, enlisted in the Air Force, and was training to fly B29 bombers when the war ended and he was discharged. He then enrolled at the University of Oregon, which he attended for two years. He married Laurie Jensen in 1960, and they



had several business ventures, developing Mobile Home Corral in Beaverton in the early 1960s and starting their own insurance agency, Jack Meeke Insurance, which they sold in 1990. Among Jack's interests with his wife and children were golfing, skiing, boating on the Columbia River, taking trips in their motor home, and spending time at their cabin at Mt. Hood. Survivors include his son, Johnny Meeke; daughter, Heidi; two grandchildren; and three stepchildren.

Michael Popovich, '51-702, of Depoe Bay, Oregon,



died June 1, 2015. Born in Chicago in 1927, Mike served in the Navy from 1944 to 1946. Upon his return, encouraged by his younger brother Joe to use their swimming talents to earn college scholarships, they headed to California. They both attended Santa Monica City College, and because there was no swim program there, they started one. Joe went on

to swim for UCLA, and Mike accepted a scholarship to the University of Oregon where he played football and swam. He went on to earn both Bachelor's and Master's degrees there. In Eugene, he met and married Karen Terry. He often flew to Chicago to visit all of his relatives there, and often felt torn between his roots in Chicago and his love for Oregon. In 2008, he played a huge role in helping his granddaughter, Lindsay Calmettes, start her business, Beatnik Studios, in Sacramento. It began as a photographers' co-op and quickly morphed into a flourishing event venue. In August 2014, he was an honored guest at the sixth-year Anniversary and grand re-opening of the building Lindsay purchased in August 2013 to house the new and improved Beatnik Studios. Mike was preceded in death by Karen in 1992 and his youngest son, Terry, in 2009. He is survived by his son, Michael; his daughter, Karen; seven grandchildren; and his great-grandson.

James A. McClaskey, '59-805, of Vancouver, Washington, passed away February 20, 2016. Jim was born in 1940 in The Dalles. He was a graduate of the University School in Victoria, B.C., the University of Oregon, and Willamette University College of Law. During his school years. Jim was heavyweight boxing champion of his high school, wrestled for the University of Oregon, and played rugby. In 1965, Jim began practicing law in Portland, but decided to enjoy some adventure before becoming immersed in his career. So off he went to Saudi Arabia, where from 1967 to 1971 he was a deep sea diver and eventually the chief operating officer of Algosaibi Diving of Saudi Arabia. Jim met his future wife, Kay, from Dublin, Ireland, in Saudi Arabia. He and Kay were married in Dublin in 1973. In 1975, Jim formed his own firm, McClaskey, Greig, Troutwine and Stoker, in Portland. In 1985, Jim merged his law firm with a Seattle firm, and from 1988 until his retirement in 2005 practiced with the Landerholm law firm in Vancouver. Jim servied on the boards of numerous civic organizations, and he and Kay were named Philanthropists of the Year for Southwest Washington in 2013. Jim is survived by his wife, Kay; sons, Matt, Mark, Paul, and Dan; and four grandchildren.

Charles Corbitt, Jr., '64-913, of Newton, Kansas, passed away December 3, 2014. He was born in 1944 in Flushing, Queens, New York, grew up in Kensington, California, and graduated from the



University of Oregon in 1966. He served in the National Guard reserves after college. He then worked for the Bank of California, was a grip man on the cable cars in San Francisco, and later was an elementary school teacher in Richmond, CA. He is survived by his brothers, Carter and Steven.

Jay C. Oakman, '67-962, a retired Commander in the Coast Guard, passed away unexpectedly at his home in San Francisco on April 10, 2016. Jay was born in 1945 in Portland, and graduated from the
